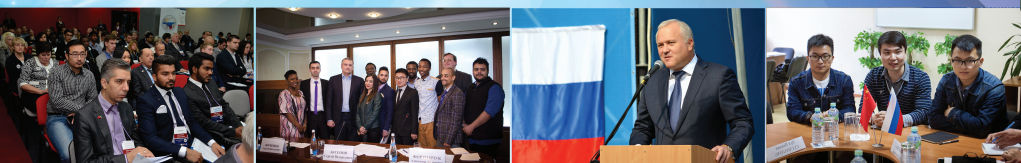




Today, V.I. Vernadsky Crimean Federal University

comprises 10 academies and institutes, 7 institutions of secondary vocational education, 12 academic branches, and 40 research and science units with 36 000 students

Today at the V.I. Vernadsky Crimean Federal University study young people from different countries of Europe, Asia, Africa and North America. They actively participate in scientific and educational, cultural and social activities of the University. The most popular areas of study are medicine, construction, architecture and economy.

3000 international students study at the V.I. Vernadsky Crimean Federal University. CFU takes 4th place in the list of Russian higher educational institutions by this criteria.
