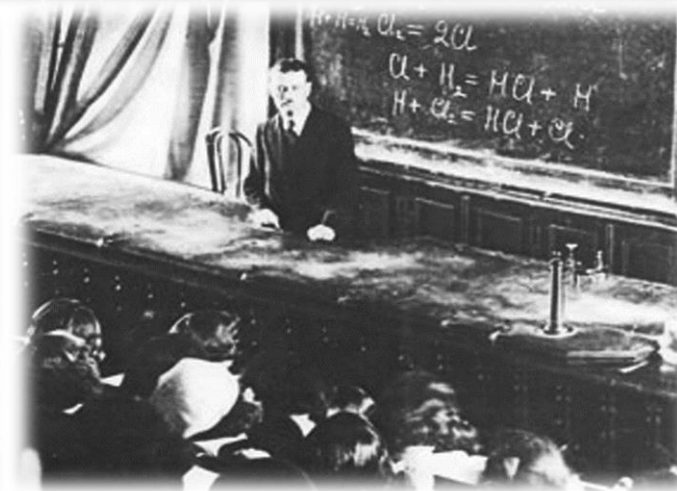

History of the University

The history of the largest university in Crimea dates back to 1918 when the peninsula's first institution for higher learning, Taurida University, was established. Among its notable founders were prominent Russian scientists Vladimir Vernadsky, Roman Helvig, Nikolai Andrusov, Mikhail Bogoslovsky, Vladimir Obruchev, and Vladimir Palladin.

Although the number one university in Crimea has born different names over the years, its essence has remained the same: high quality of education and research.

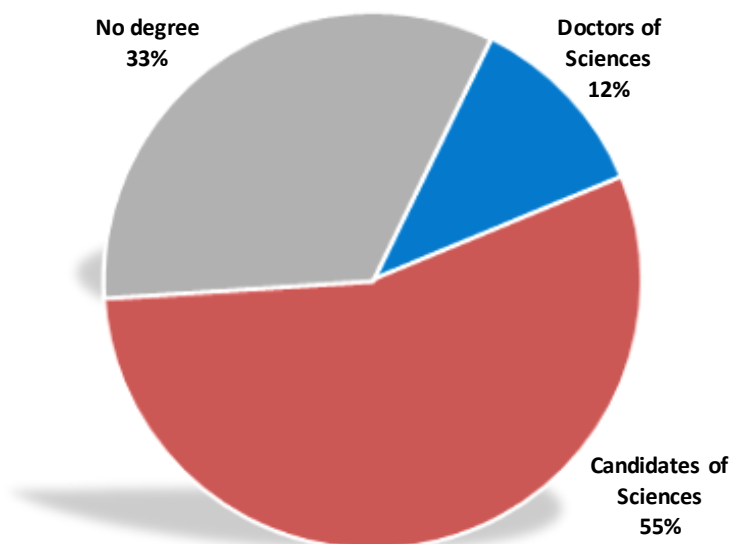

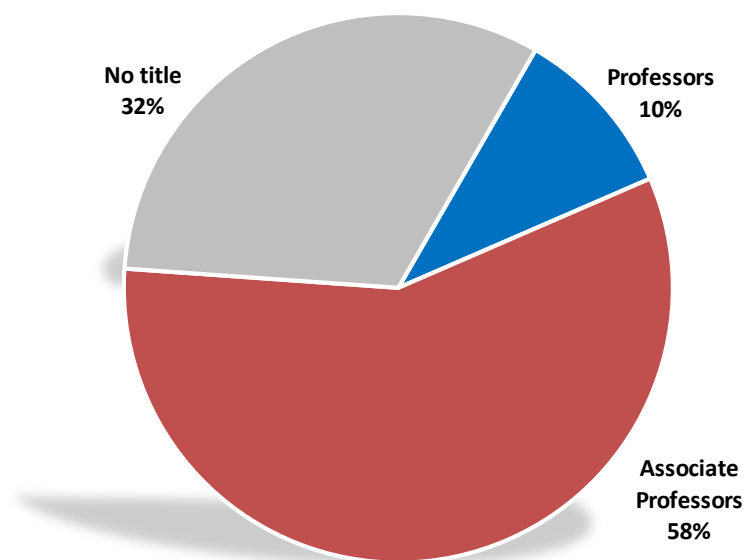

- ✓ **12** cooperation agreements have been signed between the university and international student recruitment agencies from India, Uzbekistan, Jordan, and other countries.
- ✓ A number of international students associations and communities have been set up, including associations of Armenian, Ukrainian, Turkish, Indian, and Nigerian students.

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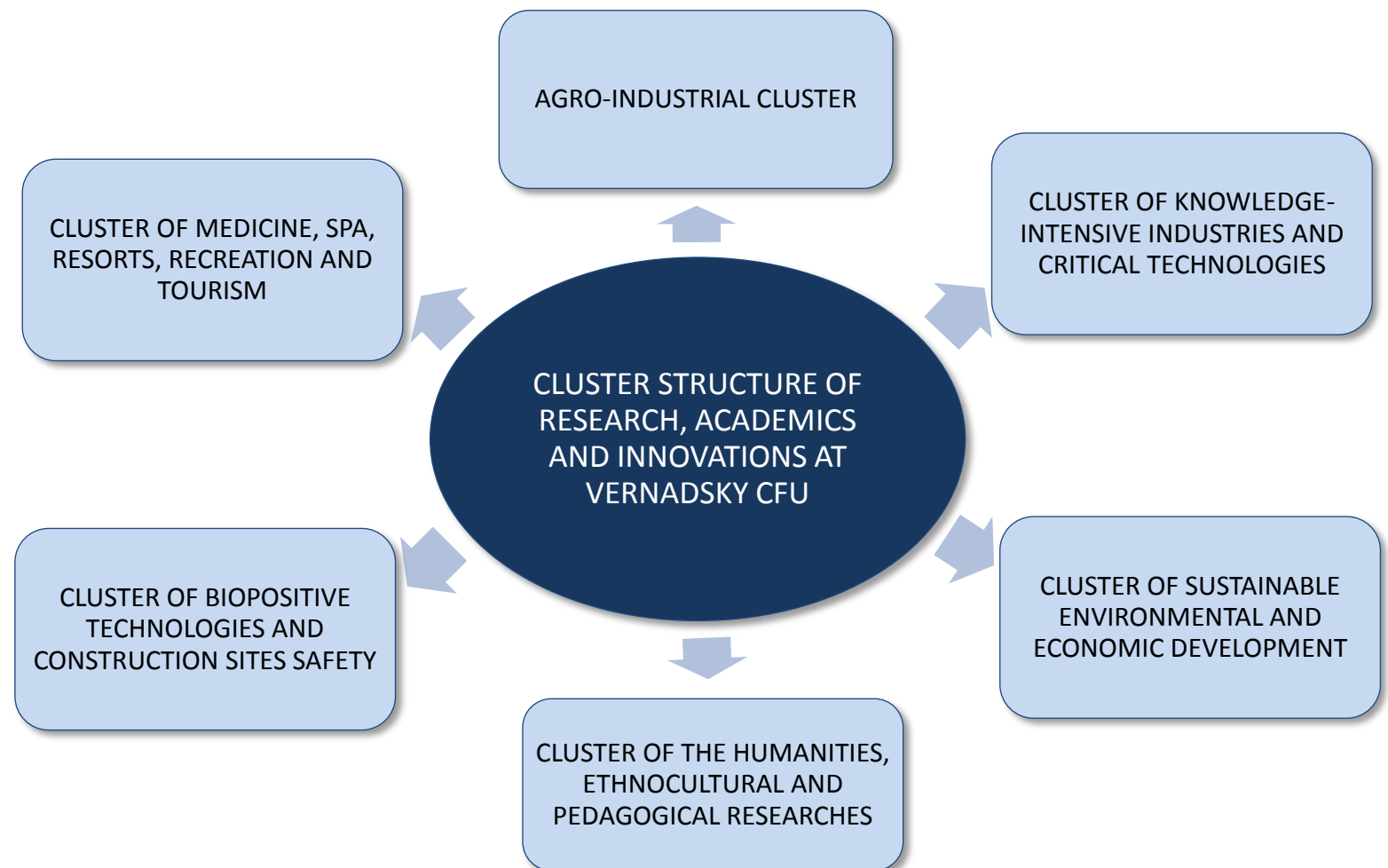
